성함이 어떻게 되세요. *Seong-ham-ee eoh-ddeoh-geh dweh-seh-yo.	이름이 뭐예요? Ee-leum-ee mweo-eh-yo	What is your name?
만나 뵈게 되서 반갑습니다. Ma-na bweb-geh dweh-seo ban-gab-seub-ni-da.	만나서 반가워요. Ma-na-seo ban-ga-weo-yo.	Nice to meet you.
잘지내십니까? Chal-ji-nae-shib-ni-ka?	잘지내요? Chal-ji-nae-yo?	How are you?
잘있습니다. 감사합니다. Chal-ee-seub-nee-da. Gam-sa-hab-ni-da.	잘지내요. 고마워요. Chal-ji-nae-yo. go-ma-weo-yo.	I'm well. Thank you.
좋은 아침입니다. Cho-eun ah-chim-ib-ni-da.	좋은 아침이에요. Cho-eun ah-cheem-ee-eh-yo	Good morning.
축하합니다. Chuk-ha-hab-ni-da	축하해요. Chuk-ha-hae-yo	Congratulations.
죄송합니다. Chweh-song-hab-ni-da.	미안해요. Mi-ahn-hae-yo.	I'm Sorry.
안녕히 가세요. Ahn-nyeong-hee ga-seh-yo	잘가요. Chal-ga-yo	Good bye.
나중에 뵈겠습니다. Na-joong-eh bweb-geh-seub-ni-da.	나중에 뵈요. Na-joong-eh bwae-yo.	See you later.

\*eo = a sound similar to both 'O' and 'U'. It sounds like the 'O' in "song" and the 'U' in "Hung."

\*Eu = a sound like saying "uh" when your teeth are closed together, but pronounce "uh" in a drawn out way.

\*I = ee
